



### **RAISE NORTH BELFAST Update on the RAISE Call for Locality Led Projects**

Following Assessment Panel, the following proposals from the RAISE North Belfast Locality have been selected to advance further in the process.

The next step in the process is to seek to agree the terms of a Letter of Offer.

Please note that this does not amount to, and must not be relied upon in any way, as a commitment to funding, and organisations must not commit to spend unless and until a Letter of Offer has been formally made by the Department and accepted by signing and returning it to the RAISE Programme Team.

In terms of next steps, a member of the RAISE Programme Team will be in contact with organisations with a view to agreeing a Letter of Offer, which will include the level of funding required to deliver the project, Project Objectives, Project Measures and Targets, a costed workplan and a profile of expenditure.

North Belfast	YEHA	The Reconnect Project: Youth Work Approach to Raising Attendance, Aspirations and Achievement for Young People	£169,170	The Reconnect Project will be delivered by the Youth Education Health Advice (YEHA) across two post primary schools working collaboratively across other community and youth settings. It is expected that the project will deliver targeted interventions using a youth work methodology to include Self-Awareness Programmes, Conflict Management and Resolution, Self-Regulation, Emotional and Social Development, Understanding Relationships with a Family Support element.

<b>North Belfast</b>	McDonald Centre	Kickstart	£25,999	The Kickstart Project will be delivered by the McDonald Centre – Crusaders FC in the Community across the locality area working with six primary schools. It is expected that the project will deliver weekly sessions engaging children in a structured sports programmes using the Soccer Brain programme to improve literacy and digital skills.
<b>North Belfast</b>	The Odyssey Trust Company Ltd. (through W5)	Story Crafters - A Gamefied Approach to Literacy at Key Stage 2	£30,922	The Story Crafters – A Gamefield Approach to Literacy at Key Stage 2 project will be delivered by the Odyssey Trust Ltd working across 4 primary schools in North Belfast. It is expected that this project using gamified learning will engage children in literacy-based workshops and by using technology and game-based challenges, engagement improve literacy skills.

<p><b>North Belfast (Greater Shankill)</b></p>	<p>Streetbeat</p>	<p>Youth Work Approach to tackle Attendance, Engagement, Confidence and Aspiration.</p>	<p>£104,490</p>	<p>The Connections - Youth Work Approach to tackle Attendance, Engagement, Confidence and Aspiration project will be delivered by StreetBeat across 13 primary and post primary schools across the locality area. It is expected that the project will provide preventive, early intervention support before attendance deteriorates. This will be delivered through one-to-one support, group mentoring, classroom support, restorative circles, out-of-school support, signposting to other services and communication with families.</p>
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<b>North Belfast (Greater Shankill)</b>	Greater Shankill Partnership	Ready to Learn Shankill	£104,996	<p>The Ready to Learn Shankill Project will be delivered by the Greater Shankill Partnership across the Greater Shankill Area. It is expected that the programme will work with all primary schools and early years providers equipping children to be developmentally ready to engage in and benefit from school life. This will be achieved through workshops, specialist speech and language support and training for early years educators.</p>
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
