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## Qualifications and Destinations of Northern Ireland School Leavers 2011/12

This statistical release presents an analysis of GCSE and A Level examination performance and destinations for pupils leaving post primary schools in 2011/12.

## Key Points

- The proportion of school leavers achieving two or more A levels or equivalent was $55.6 \%$ in 2011/12, an increase of 9.3 percentage points over the last five years from 46.3\% in 2007/08 (Table13).
- The proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent has increased by 9.6 percentage points over the last five years from 66.9\% in 2007/08 to 76.5\% in 2011/12 (Table 13).
- The proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths has increased by 5.7 percentage points over the last five years from 56.3\% in 2007/08 to $62.0 \%$ in 2011/12 (Table 13).
- Over the last five years the proportion of pupils leaving school with no GCSEs has decreased by 1.8 percentage points from $3.6 \%$ in 2007/08 to $1.8 \%$ in 2011/12. (Table 13).
- The proportion of school leavers continuing on to Institutions of Higher Education has increased by 2.4 percentage points from 39.9\% in 2007/08 to 42.3\% in 2011/12. The proportion continuing on to Institutions of Further Education increased by 5.1 percentage points from $29.5 \%$ in 2007/08 to $34.6 \%$ in 2011/12 (Table 16, Table 21 \& Appendix B).
- The proportion of pupils recorded by their school as being unemployed after leaving school decreased between 2007/08 and 2011/12 from 3.5\% to 3.2\% (Table 16, Table 21 \& Appendix B).


## Uses of Qualification and Destination data

The pupil level data collected throughout this process is used by policy teams within DE and by other users across the education service, most notably by the Education and Training Inspectorate and the Education and Library Boards (ELBs). The data are also used to respond to Assembly questions and are used in the Department's accountability and performance management process. The primary reason for this data collection exercise is to create a statistical base to inform a wide range of policy areas aimed at raising standards and tackling educational underachievement. The data are also used in the development, implementation and monitoring of policies, in particular the Literacy and Numeracy strategy, school improvement programmes and relevant Departmental Milestones. Data from the school leavers survey are used to monitor the progress against two of the key commitments in Priority One of The Programme for Government (PfG).

## Programme for Government

Building a Better Future - The Programme for Government (PfG) 2011-2015 highlights the key goals and actions the Executive will take to drive forward the priority areas.

Increase the overall proportion of young people who achieve at least 5 GCSEs at $\mathrm{A}^{*}$-C or equivalent including GCSEs in maths and English by the time they leave school to 66\% by 2014/15.

Current position: In 2011/12 the percentage of school leavers achieving 5 GCSEs $A^{*}$-C including GCSEs in maths and English was 62.0\%

## Increase the proportion of young people from disadvantaged backgrounds who achieve at least 5 GCSEs at $A^{*}$-C or equivalent including GCSEs in maths and English to 49\% by 2014/15

Current position: In 2011/12 the percentage of school leavers entitled to free school meals achieving 5 GCSEs $\mathrm{A}^{*}$-C including GCSEs in maths and English was 34.1\%.

## Recent Trends

There has been a change in the stage at which pupils are leaving school, with greater proportions of school pupils staying on at school and entering Year 13. The proportion of pupils staying on into Year 13 had increased from 57.4\% in 2007/08 to 69.2\% in $2012 / 13$. For further information on school enrolments please click here

Qualifications

## A Levels and equivalent qualifications

A Levels, including equivalents, are key indicators by which the Department benchmarks level 3 performance.

- The proportion of school leavers achieving three or more $A$ levels $A^{*}$ - $C$ or equivalent was $36.4 \%$ in $2011 / 12$, an increase of 7.4 percentage points over the last five years from $29.0 \%$ in 2007/08 (Table 13).
- The proportion of school leavers achieving two or more A levels or equivalent was $55.6 \%$ in 2011/12, an increase of 9.3 percentage points over the last five years from $46.3 \%$ in 2007/08 (Table 13).
- Girls continue to outperform boys in terms of qualifications achieved. By the time they left school $43.4 \%$ of girls achieved at least three A levels $A^{*}$-C or equivalent compared to $29.6 \%$ of boys, and $64.0 \%$ of girls achieved two or more A levels or equivalent in 2011/12 compared to $47.4 \%$ of boys (Table 1, Table 14 \& Table 15).
- The proportion of grammar school leavers achieving at least two A levels or equivalent has increased from 81.5\% in 2007/08 to 84.4\% in 2011/12. 89.2\% of grammar school girls left school with two or more A levels or equivalent compared to $79.5 \%$ of grammar school boys. The corresponding proportions achieving at least two A levels or equivalent for non grammar schools were $44.5 \%$ for girls, $25.2 \%$ for boys and $34.5 \%$ overall, an increase of 11.0 percentage points since 2007/08 when it was 23.5\% (Table 1, Appendix A).
- When religion of pupil is considered, $59.1 \%$ of Catholic school leavers achieved two or more A levels compared to 51.8\% of Protestant school leavers (Table 3).
- The proportion of pupils achieving at least two A levels or equivalent was higher for those school leavers who were not entitled to free school meals, $61.1 \%$ compared with $29.8 \%$ of school leavers entitled to free school meals (Table 5).


## GCSEs

GCSE $A^{*}-C$ including equivalents is a key indicator by which the Department benchmarks level 2 performance.

- The proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}-\mathrm{C}$ or equivalent has increased by 9.6 percentage points over the last five years from 66.9\% in 2007/08 to $76.5 \%$ in 2011/12 (Table 13).
- As in previous years the proportion of girls leaving school with at least five GCSEs or equivalent at grades $A^{*}-$ C remains higher than the proportion of boys; $82.1 \%$ of girls leaving school in 2011/12 achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}$ - C or equivalent compared to $71.0 \%$ of boys (Table 1, Table 14 \& Table 15).
- The proportion of pupils leaving grammar schools who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A* $^{*}$ C or equivalent has increased by 0.7 of a percentage point from 96.5\% in $2007 / 08$ to $97.2 \%$ in 2011/12. The corresponding proportions for non grammar schools were $47.7 \%$ and $61.3 \%$, a 13.6 percentage point increase (Table 1, Appendix A).
- The proportion of pupils with a special educational need (SEN) stage 5 who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent was $29.2 \%$ compared with $83.1 \%$ for those pupils without a SEN. 49.6\% of pupils who were recorded as having a SEN stage 1-4 achieved this standard. (Table10).
- More boys (227) leave school with no GCSEs or equivalent than girls (170), this represents $2.0 \%$ of boys and $1.5 \%$ of girls (Table 1, Table 14 \& Table 15).
- When free school meal entitlement is considered $4.5 \%$ of those entitled to free school meals leave without any GCSEs compared to $1.2 \%$ of school leavers who are not entitled to free school meals (Table 5).

A key aspect of school improvement policy is to drive up literacy and numeracy standards in schools. The Department is therefore committed to ensuring that more children achieve a good standard of literacy and numeracy skills in order to better equip them for employability and/or further study.

- Overall $62.0 \%$ of school leavers achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths, up from 56.3\% in 2007/08 (Table 13).
- There is a 14.5 percentage point gap between the proportion of pupils achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths (62.0\%) and the proportion of pupils achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}-\mathrm{C}$ or equivalent (76.5\%) (Table 13).
- 67.8\% of girls achieve at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with $56.3 \%$ of boys, a difference of 11.5 percentage points (Table $1 \&$ Table 9 ).
- $94.1 \%$ of grammar school leavers left with at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths, and $97.2 \%$ left with at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent, a difference of 3.1 percentage points. The corresponding proportions for non grammar school leavers were $38.5 \%$ and $61.3 \%$ respectively, a difference of 22.8 percentage points (Table 1).
- Again, looking at the difference between these two indicators, 63.5\% of Catholic school leavers left with at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths, and 78.8\% left with at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent a difference of 15.3 percentage points. The corresponding proportions for Protestant school leavers were $60.2 \%$ and $73.8 \%$ respectively, a difference of 13.6 percentage points (Table $3 \&$ Table 9 ).
- 19.7\% (116) of Protestant boys entitled to free school meals achieve at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with $33.2 \%$ (415) of Catholic boys entitled to free school meals. Catholic girls entitled to free school meals $(43.8 \%, 557)$ outperform Protestant girls entitled to free school meals $(32.4 \%, 182)$ in achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-\mathrm{C}$ or equivalent including GCSE English and maths (Table 8).
- Geographically the data can be analysed in terms of the school leaver's place of residence and the location of their school. When education and library board (ELB) of school is considered, $67.5 \%$ of Belfast school leavers achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A $^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with 55.4\% of school leavers resident in the Belfast Education and Library Board area. In contrast, $60.3 \%$ of school leavers attending schools in the South Eastern Education and Library Board achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with 67.1\% of school leavers resident in the South Eastern Education and Library Board. The remaining three Board areas only displayed minor differences between where the pupil lives and where the school is located, less than 3 percentage points in the NEELB and less than 1 percentage point in the WELB and SELB Board areas (Table 11 \& 12).


## Destinations

Main destinations of school leavers are reported by the school leavers and recorded by the school.

- In total 42.3\% of pupils leaving school in 2011/12 entered Higher Education Institutions (HEls). At 49.5\% the proportion of girls continuing on to HEls is higher than for boys (35.4\%) (Table 16).
- At $15.5 \%$ the proportion of boys entering Training is much greater than for girls at 6.6\% (Table 16).
- Overall 94.2\% of school leavers were recorded by their school as entering Education, Employment or Training. When school type is considered, 97.0\% of grammar school leavers and $92.2 \%$ of non grammar school leavers were recorded as having these destinations (Table 16).

- When religion of pupil is considered 39.2\% of Protestant school leavers enter Institutions of Higher Education compared with $45.2 \%$ of Catholic school leavers (Table 17).
- School leavers not entitled to free school meals are more likely to continue their education with 80.2\% entering institutions of Higher or Further Education compared to $61.8 \%$ of leavers who were entitled to free school meals (Table 19).
- $5.8 \%$ of all school leavers were recorded as unemployed or their destination was unknown. For pupils entitled to free school meals this figure was $10.5 \%$ compared with $4.8 \%$ for those pupils not entitled to free school meals (Table 16 \& Table 19).
